



General Information

1. All games are played at the Oak Brook Park District Family Recreation Center, 1450 Forest Gate Rd. Oak Brook, IL. 60523.
2. Please observe the **no smoking** rule on Park District property.
3. Spectators are welcome, but we ask for safety's sake, that they remain away from the immediate area and in the designated spectator area.
4. Game balls will be provided. Gym shoes and proper attire are required to play.
5. Per instruction from the Oak Brook Park District Insurance Carrier, those participating in park district sponsored athletic programs must sign a waiver form in order to be eligible for competition.
6. At the discretion of the OBPD or game officials, a spectator may be asked to leave the facility due to inappropriate behavior.
7. **Teams must have the same colored jersey or shirts.**
8. Grades are determined by the grade the child is going into in the fall.
9. Any rule and/or regulation is subject to change during the tournament at the discretion of the Oak Brook Park District staff.

Tournament Structure

1. Each team is guaranteed 3 games.
2. There will be one court monitor/official per basket.
3. Absolutely no arguing with the officials. Fighting and/or swearing will not be tolerated. The officials will have the authority to warn and/or expel from the premises any player, substitute or spectator who interferes with the orderly progress of the game. Expulsion from any game prohibits participation in the rest of the tournament.
4. Teams may consist of a minimum of three players and a maximum of five players. If an injury or other circumstance happens where a team has less than 3 players, the game will continue with that team being shorthanded.
5. Teams must register for the age bracket of the oldest player on the team. (Ex: If a team has two 4th graders and one 6th grader, they would register for the 5th/6th grade division).
6. Co-Ed teams must register for the boy's division.
7. A player may only play for one team.
8. Seeding is determined by overall win/loss record. If there is a tie, it's determined by head-to-head win/loss. If it's still tied, it's determined by point differential. If it's still tied, it's determined by defensive points allowed. If it remains tied, then a free throw shootout will commence.

The Game

1. Teams must have a minimum of three players ready to play by the designated playing time or a forfeit will be ruled.
2. Games are considered official after 15 minutes has elapsed on the official court time-clock, or one of the teams reaches 15 points. Whichever comes first.
3. Game clock does NOT stop for any reason. Severe injury timeouts will be a judgement call by the court monitor.
4. If the game is still tied after 15 minutes, teams will enter into a free-throw shootout. Each team picks one representative to shoot one free-throw. If it's still tied, they will choose a different player and continue until one team makes it and the other team does not.
5. Possession does **not** change after each score. Make it take it.
6. Defensive rebounds must be taken beyond the 3-point arch to transfer possession. Once the defensive rebound is secured, it is a free back to the 3-point line for that team.
7. Scoring goes by 1 and 2. A normal field goal or free throw is 1 point. A basket beyond the 3-point arch is worth 2 points. Scoring discrepancies should be brought up to the court monitor's attention immediately.
8. A foul on the ground results in a checked ball up top to the team that was fouled. A shooting foul results in 1 free throw. If the team makes it, they receive the ball checked up top. If they miss, the ball is checked up top to the defensive team. In the last one minute, every foul is a shooting foul.
9. Traveling, double-dribble, up-and-down, etc. will result in a turnover of possession.
10. Rock, paper, scissors will determine which team starts with the ball. In an elimination game, the higher seed starts with the ball.
